

CDFA Tax Credit Award and Basic Program Background

Supporting the construction of the Mathey Center for People and Nature and the John P. Chase Farmhouse Renovation

SELT has received \$450,000 in tax credits to help establish its <u>Mathey Center for People and Nature at Burley Farms</u> and renovate the John P. Chase Farmhouse. Both are located off Rt. 125 in Epping. SELT will need to sell a minimum of \$225,000 in tax credits between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021 and another \$225,000 in tax credits between July 1, 2021 and June 30 2020.

Tax Credits 101

- Donation paid directly to CDFA during State FY21 and State FY22 via CDFA web portal
- State tax credit issued equal to 75% of contribution
- State tax credits applied against Business Profits Tax (BPT), Business Enterprise Tax (BET), and/or Insurance Premium Tax
- Any New Hampshire business (or national business with a NH employee base) and subject to the above taxes may be interested in purchasing tax credits
- Tax credits may be used by participating businesses at any time for five successive years
- Donation eligible for treatment as a federal charitable contribution, increasing tax efficiency of a gift to near 90%, depending on the business and its unique tax situation

Basic Case for Support for Center for People and Nature at Burley Farms

Through the construction of a new energy-efficient building and the rehabilitation of a historic 1790s John Prescott Chase Farmhouse, SELT will transform the 237-acre Burley Farms into a hub for community-based conservation. Key goals include:

- Indoor and outdoor space to support nature-based engagement and programs, including events led by SELT, community organizations, and partners;
- A working farm, growing food for our communities with affordable housing to support the farmer and caretaker;
- A public trail system sharing nearly 1,000 acres of woods and fields along the Wild & Scenic Lamprey River;
- Permanent offices for SELT (with space to grow), partner non-profits, and a community meeting room; and
- 100% powered by on-site solar production!
